




BOP Total Club Members




>>> BOP Total Swimmers by Club

>>> Chair Report 2024

On behalf of the Swimming Bay of Plenty Board it is my privilege to table this Annual Report for the past season 2023-2024 and it is with pleasure that I present the Chair's Report.

The 2023 - 2024 season has marked my first year as Swimming BOP Chair. Although I am reasonably novice in the position I have been fortunate enough to be surrounded by a very supportive board.

I have been involved in swimming in the Bay of Plenty for nearly 15 years, firstly through my kids and shortly after as a technical official.

Swimming BOP represents 9 Clubs and 1607 members and I am pleased to see that our overall member numbers have grown slightly this year, particularly in the swimmer category.

Congratulations to all those swimmers who attended National events. This year Swimmers from our region broke 47 Regional Records at a mix of events from Club to National.

Swimming Bay of Plenty has made a slight profit this year which is really great. We are the only region that does not rely heavily on securing funding to run, and our cost to our members for both membership and events entry is one of the lowest if not the lowest in NZ.

Moving forward there are going to be a number of challenges for the Region and Clubs. We will be working to adopt the new constitution, and looking at what the future looks like for our sport, how to increase and retain members and keep swimming fun.

I would like to thank all the Coaches, Officials, parents and individuals who work tirelesly to provide opportunities for all of our athletes.

I would also like to thank the Events and Technical sub committees for their hard work in and around events over the last year and I would like to thank the board for their ongoing dedication and support.

>>> Technical Commitee Report

It has been another busy year with all things swimming getting back to normal slowly, culminating with the Olympics and Para Olympics.

Firstly, can I thank my technical team for your contributions throughout the season, and to all our wonderful Technical Officials, including timekeepers, without you these meets don't happen.

I acknowledge Ellen Sherwood and Lisa Rowland and apologies to other's I may have omitted for your continued Swimming Bay of Plenty representation at Swimming NZ Meets, despite neither of you having swimmers that compete any longer.

Swimming New Zealand have made many changes to the competition pathway, which includes the ability to run "development meets". One positive impact of non-designated meets is it allows our hardworking experienced officials, who volunteer their precious time (over 80% no longer have active swimmer's) to take some well earned time off, thus meaning when we do have a designated meet we can have a full complement of lead officials ready to go.

The pathway for technical officials is being streamlined nationally. Whilst I don't necessarily agree with the proposed pathways for the Technical Pathway, they have made up their minds, so we will work to do what we can.

I would encourage clubs to engage parents to become engaged at club nights and step into new roles without the fear of not being qualified and facing writing DQ's, this may lead to officiating at development meets and then perhaps with encouragement can lead to further training and qualifications. The introduction of learning certificates for swimmers has been a great step towards this process also.

On reflection of the exams undertaken in the last year; the percentage of exams completed is down and may decline further, like a lot of sports swimming is not immune to the changing financial times and parents stretched in many directions.

Thank you all again for your support of Swimming Bay of Plenty and I look forward to another successful season with you all.

>>> Event Commitee Report

The 2023-2024 swimming season has been an eventful and successful year for our region. Our focus remained on delivering well-organized, competitive, and fun events for swimmers of all levels. The following report outlines key events, participation, challenges, and achievements from this past year.

1. Key Events:

Throughout the year, we hosted 7 successful events, ranging from Junior Series Development Meets to Official Designated Meets. Here is a summary of the major events:

Junior Series:

This series focused on junior swimmers. Participation was strong with from 120-130 swimmers from 8 clubs over the four meets, contributing to a great atmosphere and fostering racing development. Thanks to Whakatane and LVW Aquatics for hosting two of the series.

Junior Clash and Showdown

These are our two major regional competitions with Age Group event medals awarded. It was pleasing to see participation numbers up on the previous year in both events. We saw exceptional performances, with many personal bests and regional records broken.

Classic and Rising Stars Events

These two events are our most successful and grow from strength to strength each season. Record numbers in attendance at both events this season.

Senior Splash

This event was a new event to our calendar this season and the numbers were pleasing.

2. Participation & Growth:

This year, we saw a significant increase in swimmer participation across all age groups:

Swimmers:

We had 13.5% more participants compared to last year. Notably, our junior participation grew by 11%.

Income:

We are conscious of the financial restraints on many families so continue to keep our entry fees to a minimum and have had no increases for a number of years making us one of the cheapest across the country to enter an event. Although we are noticing a slight drop in the number of events athletes are entering, we made a slight increase on income.

Volunteers & Officials:

Thank you to our dedicated volunteers and officials. For Designated Events we need a minimum of 20 officials assisting to ensure that the event is ratified so are so grateful for the support. Our events do run smoothly and efficiently so a huge thanks to you all. Where possible we target several of our events as development Meets which gives our membership a chance to try new roles pool deck without having to be qualified. This takes pressure of our qualified officials so we can ensure they are available for the designated meets which our athletes need for National times etc.



3. Achievements:

Records Broken: Our swimmers broke numerous club records and 47 regional records.

Qualifiers: We had good representation at National Events with some stellar achievements.

Volunteer Shortages: While we had a dedicated group of volunteers, there were moments when we were short on officials, particularly at larger meets. We need to encourage more members to get involved.

Scheduling Conflicts: Some events coincided with other competitions, which led to a few clashes in participation due to the nonalignment of other Regional and National Events. There has been a lot of work to ensure this does not happen with SNZ and our regional collegues moving forward which is pleasing.

4. Future Goals:

Increase Volunteer Base: We aim to conduct outreach to recruit more parents and community members to become officials and event helpers.

Host of National Events: Given our Regional's growing reputation of running good events, we are excited to host the Junior Festival for SNZ in March 2025 and have been asked to continue to deliver the AIMS Swimming component.

Focus on Junior Development: Expanding our junior program to help nurture our young athletes

Focus on more opportunities for Senior's: With the rising costs of travel etc we are looking at adding more events to our calendar for our senior athletes without having to travel.

Conclusion: The 2023-2024 season has been one of growth, success, and learning for us all. We look forward to building on these achievements and overcoming challenges in the coming year. A special thanks to all swimmers, parents, coaches, volunteers, and officials for their unwavering support.

Let's keep the momentum going for another great season ahead!




