


NB: Trg, Gre and Otu added together for Evo totals 2015-2018

Chair Report

On behalf of the Swimming Bay of Plenty Board it is my privilege to table this Annual Report for the past season 2022-2023 and it is with pleasure that I present the Chair's Report.

2022/2023 season has marked my second & final year as Swimming BOP Chair. It has been a season that has seen clubs and regions still having to navigate our way back to a new norm after Covid. Our clubs and our region have got back into the swing of things – athlete's and officials have slowly returned back to the pool. There has been some fantastic work done around getting our athlete's back in the pool and our clubs are taking great initiative in this effort.

Swimming BOP represents 9 Clubs and 1595 members. Each day, dedicated individuals work to provide opportunities for athletes of all ages, genders, ethnic backgrounds, and physical abilities to engage in our great sport – swimming.

There has been some great work done by our examiners in recruiting and signing up new officials within the region and some focus on senior / ex swimmers who want to give back to the sport. The Technical committee also delivered the Swim BOP Technical pathway earlier this year which has provided a good spike in the number of trainee officials we now have. The pathway has provided some confidence as to how long it will take training at each step of the pathway. I believe however we need to consider some timeframes around time on each step so as to allow our officials to gain competence at each step.

I want to thank all those that volunteer their time, skills, and energy on their Club boards. To all those members that contribute to our sport in any shape and form I thank you. There have been some positives: 64 BOP Records were broken and during the National competitions we had a good showing and SBOP athletes showed that they are competitive on the National stage.

As region we continued to focus internally and taking on board opportunities to change and do things better for our sport across the region. However we ran a very successful reconnection meeting with our clubs and are still implementing some of the ideas covered.

The Events and Technical committees have ended their 2 year tenure and expressions of interest are sought for a further 2 year tenure on these committees. Both committees have performed well.

Financially your region is in good shape. This has been due to prudent fiscal management of regional funds.

As stated earlier this year is my last on the board having served all my permitted term concurrently. I would like to thank all those board members that have served with me over this period. I would like to thank Bronwen for the guidance given as I stepped into the Chairs role. I would also like to thank the current board and wish them every success in the future years.

Our Calendar for the 2022/2023 season was a result of a collaboration with our Coaches lead by Matt White. We are grateful to Matt for all the behind the scenes work with our coaches which resulted in the pulling together of a calendar which catered for all swimmers of all ages. The result of this collaboration saw our events have consistent strong numbers at all events. We thank all our coaches for what they do and their support of our Events.

Our events committee work hard but there is also a group of individuals behind the scenes that work just as hard to ensure the events happen on the day. There is constant packing and unpacking and repacking of gear. There are early starts and late finishes to set-up and pack down. There is transporting equipment, maintenance of the equipment, photocopying of programmes, ribbons and medals and the list goes on. A massive thankyou to all those that have helped. I am always in awe of the work you all do. You all know who you are. When I think about the events, we have pulled together for 2022/23 it is impressive particularly under some difficult times with pools out of operational during the season. This initiative of SNZ allows Clubs the ability to host events such as the Junior Series without the pressure of providing a full contingent of qualified officials.

The event, we as a Team, are most proud of was the Swimming for Swimming HBPB. This event was organised as a fundraiser for Swimming HBPB so they could help those families most deserving after the devastation the floods caused. Thanks to all those that supported this event and the private donations received. \$10,000 was raised. This event was a huge success and showed how our members can pull together and look after our regional colleagues at the same time as having great fun. The idea for this event grew from the tough times we all witnessed and how it is so important to look after each other. The event was just a simple way we could show support to those who are in need.

May I express my personal thanks to the Board of Swimming Bay of Plenty for their support. The journey we have undertaken has seen a lot of change and has carried many of us outside our comfort zones with several changes in how our events are delivered and the placing of events. I believe that we are better equipped today to continue facing the challenges of a complex future with our sport
