




NB: Trg, Gre and Otu added together for Evo totals 2015-2018

Chair's Report

On behalf of the Swimming Bay of Plenty Board it is my privilege to table this Annual Report for the past season 2020-2021 and it is with pleasure that I present the Chair's Report.

2020 - 2021 has been a very unusual year for swimming. Our members have had to cope with closed pools, closed borders, social distancing, and isolation. It is a tremendous tribute to all swimmers, coaches, officials, volunteers, and their families that we have all survived and we even have had some Clubs achieve membership growth this year and finish in a strong financial position! With the postponement of many events our athlete's training and competition has been totally upended and yet we have seen extraordinary resilience and adaptability from our swimming community to these challenging and changing circumstances. Well, done to everyone. Our coaches continued support to their athletes throughout these challenging times is to be commended. SBOP recognises the vital role our coaches play in the sport and our engagement with our coaching community remains a high priority. Along with our coaches, SBOP recognises the importance of nurturing and developing our technical officials and our volunteers within our Clubs. I would encourage Clubs to focus on nurturing more officials and volunteers within their club structure. Our Technical sub-committee is always happy to train Club members. Our technical officials and volunteers continue to be a vital ingredient in the success of all our meets.

Swimming BOP represents 9 Clubs and 1793 members. Each day, dedicated individuals work to provide opportunities for athletes of all ages, genders, ethnic backgrounds, and physical abilities to engage in our great sport – swimming.

Over the season 120 BOP Records were broken and 3 athletes were placed on International Teams. During the National competitions that did go ahead we had a strong showing and SBOP athletes showed that they are competitive on the National stage winning National titles, numerous podium placings, a Regional 4th placing at 2021 AON NZ Swimming Champs and Evolution Aquatics Tauranga taking a credible 5th placing at the 2021 AON NZ Age Group Championships. Despite these uncertain times SBOP has done well to retain the majority of our members and finish in an OK financial position in spite of us investing in our swimming community by removing regional fees for the 2021-2021 seasons and discounting them for the upcoming season.

We have seen a major change with how events are to be delivered, and along with Covid remaining at the forefront of our minds and with us all remaining in a state of high alert to any transmission we have many challenges ahead of us. I urge everyone to put aside their differences so the sport can continue to thrive.

Nothing could take place without the support of several people. My heartful thanks goes to our Clubs that have done much of the heavy lifting in terms of supporting their members during Covid disruptions and we thank all our Club officials. I would like to extend a very big "Thank you" to my fellow Board Members who provide a level of guidance and stability in these uncertain times and our Admin Officer Karen Nixon.

It is hard to put into words what my time as chair means. I was a swim parent, volunteer, official and fell in love with the sport and just wanted to play a small part in our sport. As I step down from the Board, I am full of pride and appreciation of you all and thank you all for the opportunity I have had to serve you all.

Talitha McEwan World Junior Open Water Championships (Seychelles)

- Very Successful 2021 Aon New Zealand Swimming Championships with 100% personal best times; 5 Bay of Plenty Open Records; 6 Bay of Plenty Age records; 4 swimmers ranked in NZ Top 10 and Evolution ranking 11th in the club scoring for the meet
- Successful 2021 Aon NZ Age Group Championships with with 74% personal best times;
 4 Bay of Plenty age records; 7 swimmers ranked in National age top 10 rankings and Evolution Aquatics placing 5th in the club scoring for the meet.
- A very successful Open water season with a win at NZ Open water championships (Talitha McEwan 1st 7.5KM), along with wins and placings at Round the Mount and "Legend of the lake" in Rotorua
- Evolution Aquatics continued support of the community through:Support for School swimming sports - Evolution as the delivering partner with Sport BOP running the BOP NZ Sec School Swimming Sports in March 2021 and WBOP Zone Year 5, 6, 7 & 8 summer school swimming sports in April 2021.
- Evolution Aquatics took the opportunity to submit feedback to Tauranga City Council's Long term plan and took the opportunity for some of our senior swimmers to represent the submission in front of Commissioners. Our goal was to put support for a 50m pool in Tauranga. Very proud of our swimmer representing the swimming community and our club.





Kawerau District Council is doing major work on our pool, including -rebuilding the old changing rooms into our new Swimming Club rooms -drilling a new geothermal borehole that will heat the Maurie Kjar Memorial Swimming Pool Complex -replacing the electrical systems for the splash pad and electrical work with the pool's entrance and office areas



- Olympics: Hayden Wilde, who is a valued club member at LVWASC, won BRONZE at the Olympic Games. He was the first medallist for NZ at Tokyo
- Participation: Significantly more swimmers attended camps, key meets, especially juniors
