




NB: Trg, Gre and Otu added together for Evo totals 2015-2018

Chair Report

On behalf of the Swimming Bay of Plenty Board it is my privilege to table this Annual Report for the past season 2021-2022 and it is with pleasure that I present the Chair's Report.

2021/2022 season has marked my first year as Swimming BOP Chair. It has been a season that has seen clubs and regions come out of Covid hibernation. The new norms that Covid has left us with have in themselves provided challenges. Slowly our clubs and our region are starting to get back into the swing of things – athlete's and officials slowly coming back to the pool. Getting our heads around the impact Covid has made on our sport will take some time. There has been some fantastic work done around getting our athlete's back in the pool and our clubs are taking great initiative in this effort.

Swimming BOP represents 9 Clubs and 1630 members. Each day, dedicated individuals work to provide opportunities for athletes of all ages, genders, ethnic backgrounds, and physical abilities to engage in our great sport – swimming.

There has been some great work done by our examiners in recruiting and signing up new officials within the region and some focus on senior / ex swimmers who want to give back to the sport. However, we are unsure of what net gain this has provided as it is evident from recent meets that some of our more experienced officials appear to have moved on throughout the Covid hibernation.

As a region our situation has evolved somewhat differently compared to original plans, for clubs to have managed the transition and come out the other side in good shape is impressive and a to all. It has been an eventful time and I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for your support.

I want to thank all those that volunteer their time, skills, and energy on their Club boards. To all those members that contribute to our sport in any shape and form I thank you. There have been some positives: 49 BOP Records were broken and during the National competitions that did go ahead we had a good showing and SBOP athletes showed that they are competitive on the National stage. Despite these uncertain times SBOP has done well to retain the majority of our members and finish in an OK financial position

As region we have focused internally and taking on board opportunities to change and do things better for our sport across the region. Kane Radford has for this reason taken on a coach/ athlete liaison role and reports directly to the board ideas emerging from coaches and athletes.

The Events and Technical committees were re-configured and expressions of interest sought for a 2 year tenure on these committees. There was a need to have these committees operating more transparently to our board. Covid provided some challenges initially in getting these committees up and running but they are now both meeting regularly and providing 2 monthly reports to the board.

Financially your region is in good shape. This has been due to prudent fiscal management of regional funds. Our board has invested in our swimming community by removing regional fees for the 2021-2022 seasons and discounting them for the upcoming season. However

we will be reviewing these subsidies with a view of bringing fees back to at least the level achieved pre covid.

At the recent Swimming NZ AGM workshop discussion was held around one of the sports major concerns. We continue to lose a huge number of Athlete's from our sport from the age of 16 and upwards. A number of issues drive this, burnout, peer pressure, a desire to compete in other sports and cost, to name a few. No real solutions have yet been identified but there was consensus that we need to bring fun back to our sport. An example was shared of how the sport of high diving addressed its falling numbers by introducing the Manu (bomb) competition and numbers increased.

I would like to challenge our member clubs to start thinking of ways we can increase interest in our sport and retain these older athletes.

The upcoming season promises to be a good one for our region both in and out of the pool and I wish all our member clubs all the best.


