




Club Number Graphs




NB: Trg, Gre and Otu added together for Evo totals 2015-2018

Swimming BOP Club Highlights



- The first was the staging of our first ever EVO winter champs in Hamilton which was a tremendous success.
- EVO trip to the SA champs in Adelaide. Great to see all the fundraising prior as well as the fun and excellent results in the actual comp.
- NZ Short Course A stunning performance across the board saw Evolution Aquatics Tauranga finish in the runner-up position at the 2019 New Zealand Short Course (25m pool) Swimming Championships in the Age Group rankings.
- Surviving Covid-19



- Having 5 swimmers attending this years Junior Aquaknights Festival, we have increased our numbers attending continually over the last 3 years.
- We had over 40 Afternoon swimmers and our February Learn to Swim had over 50 swimmers.
- Our new clubrooms have started. The old floor is currently being smashed and removed to then put new floors and other stuff to be completed. Hopefully the ball keeps moving and we are able to move into the new rooms at the beginning of next year.





- Culture: We have identified three key qualities that swimmers, coaches and whanau contribute to the culture making it a great place to be in the water: Hungry, Humble and Smart
- Participation: Significantly more swimmers attended key meets, both juniors and seniors
- Resilience: Successfully getting through the Covid-19 lock down
- Collaboration: Successful swim camp with Mt Maunganui Swimming Club, secured external funding of over \$5,000 too



- The expansion of our of swim programme by securing extra lanes which we have been unable to do for many years
- Getting through Covid 19 and keeping our swimmer base occupied and enthusiastic about swimming
- Results from NZ Short Course, including our relay teams
- Our junior swimmers...who are such an integral part of our club and who always make us smile.



- Securing the Papamoa School Pool for use 8 months of the year
- Growth in our squad numbers for both the winter and summer seasons
- Increase in our competitive swimmer numbers currently 31 club swimmer and 6 comp
- Successful funding applications for our operational costs





- Though COVID-19 impacted our pool time, Swim Rotorua concentrated our efforts on connecting our swimmers in as many innovative ways as we could. We had a clear focus on maintaining connections, financial sustainability and the wellbeing of our tamariki.
- We have also been mindful that our whanau may have been impacted by COVID-19 and we have worked hard to ensure we have a robust scholarship fund available if required by club members.
- Over the last year we have recruited a new Head Coach, Aidan Withington. Aidan and his whanau came from Wellington to join us and we are thrilled to have him here in Rotorua and in the Bay of Plenty. Aidan is an up and coming young coach and a perfect fit for Swim Rotorua. Aidan has looked hard at our programmes and made changes which have been beneficial to the whole Swim Rotorua team. Our athletes have continued to develop under his leadership. We have remained strong throughout all ages and we have a very strong junior team in development. At the SNZ short course champs in Hamilton our team came home with medals which was a pleasing result.
- Swim Rotorua has remained connected to our community in many ways and support the Make a Difference Water Safety programme, Weetbix Tryathlon and volunteering at many other events when and if we are able.



- In partnership with the Taupo District Council and the Taupo Water Safety Group we have purchased and installed a set of Anti Wave 800 Start Blocks
- The25m indoor pool sides have been converted to flush drainage and along with new lane ropes and the start blocks this should make the Taupo Pool a great pool to compete in.
- Coaching Services are now being provided to Taupo Swimming Club Members by Hillary Westerhoff and her new company WavePlus
