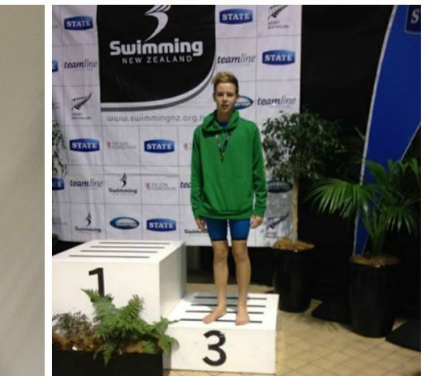

Obituary

Norman James Jeffs **30 March 1933- 9 October 2013**

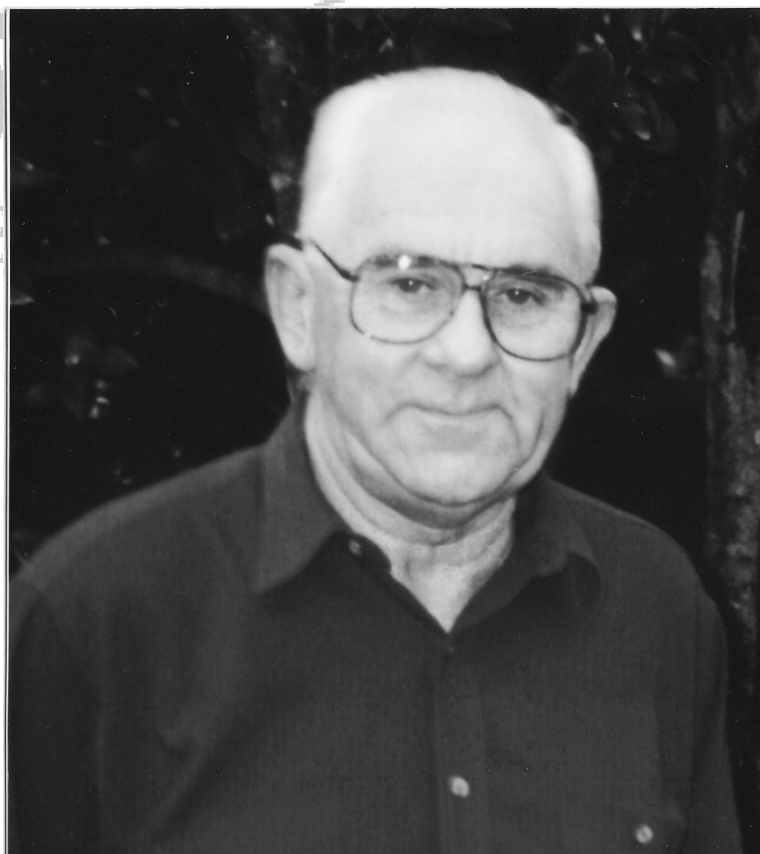
Norm was a Life Member of Swimming Bay of Plenty, Recipient of a SNZ Service Award (2002), SNZ Honours (2010) and a recipient of the prestigious SNZ Jackie Clarke Award 2009.

Norm was instrumental in his daughter Toni Jeffs becoming one of our decorated Olympic (1992) and Commonwealth Games 1990, 1994, 1998 (Bronze medallist) and 2002 (Bronze medallist) swimmers. Norm was her primary coach in her earlier years.

His involvement in our sport started back in the 1970's and has never wavered and he continued to be involved in all aspects of swimming.

He was well known for his kind and gentle way. We were appreciative of his quiet and non-judgmental advice and encouragement. Norm's extraordinary life of service to swimming was immeasurable

He will be sadly missed by us all and has left a large gap in our community. Our deepest sympathies remain with Glenyce and her family on the tragic loss of a dearly loved father and husband – we can only begin to imagine the huge void which remains in their lives but we hope they can find time to cherish the memories of a life lived to the full.



PRESIDENTS REPORT

Let me begin my stating that this past year has been very very good.

Swimming Bay of Plenty is, in some way, important to each of us. Athletes are what we are all about. I would like to share a quote from one of the world's great presidents. Theodore Roosevelt, he said;

Every child has inside them an aching void for excitement. If we don't fill it with something that is exciting, interesting and good for them, they will fill it with something that is exciting, interesting and which is not good for them.

Swimming has been supplying that excitement in a way that's good for children.

From our 9year olds through to our 20+ year olds, Swimming Bay of Plenty had a strong presence at a variety of National and International events throughout the season. We had an increase in podium finishes with a total of **92 podium** finishes this season. There were so many reasons to be proud this season. Whether it was a best time, BOP record, SNZ record, National team selection or simply improving technique and race strategy all swimmers brought something to the table.

Every day I am in awe seeing all the youngest and the oldest integrating with each other. Please take a minute and look around and reflect on what is really going on. It is what the sport and organisation is about. We are blessed with the most caring, hardworking, passionate people one could ask for. We make mistakes sometimes from time to time but who does not. But do not look for blame as we all put our heart and soul into what we are doing. Too often we forget, or take for granted, all the hard work that is done by people and the situations they deal with through the season. Without their commitment and goodwill we would be unable to provide what we do.

Swimming Bay of Plenty is committed to offering all our athletes opportunities to participate in our sport. We must continue to strive for excellence in all aspects of Bay of Plenty Swimming, including our administration, our competition at junior level right through to national and elite level, our development and pathways for younger swimmers, and development and education for our coaches and officials. We have a new generation of swimmers that we need to accommodate for. Sports in general are changing quickly in New Zealand and around the world. Professionalism in sport, lack of time and technology has had a big part to play in that. Swimming has to keep up with the changes and adapt. We need to adapt within our region to keep the sport vibrant and challenging for the children swimming while maintaining excellence in the sport. It's a reality and we must move with it.

Our finances are in order and we have continued with investing in our swimmers. We have continued with the opening the communication lines through the Liaison officers.

The successes in our region this year have been exciting. It means we are doing something right. However, there is never not a time when we cannot improve. Our successes this year must be developed and refined to be even more successful next season. Some of the successes this year are as follows:

The Central Swimming concept continues to be an achievement, such that we had swimmers selected for both the Victorian Age Group Tour and the Inaugural Tri series Tour.

The standard of our swimmers has lifted significantly at the top level. Our swimmers have been chosen for Oceania's, Pan Pacs, and the Swimming New Zealand National Age Group and Junior Development Programme.

Our finances are healthy despite the lack of funding

The 2013 Swimming Bay of Plenty Short Course Championships, was again a phenomenal success. This was due to the fantastic efforts of our parent volunteers, the meet administrators, and of course the calibre of the athletes. This meet more than maintained its reputation as one of the premier competitions in New Zealand.

A very successful Junior Camp was held prior to Nationals.

A revamped Awards Brunch that celebrated the unique dedication and hard work of all our swimmers and volunteers. It recognized a selection of swimmers and volunteers who epitomize what swimming is all about.

To continue with these achievements this past year we must keep challenging ourselves to do things better and think of new ways to improve. There are a number of new initiatives on the table which we are excited to be bringing to our clubs and athletes this coming season.

After all is said and done, I am very, very proud of our swimmers, coaches, parents, and volunteers--and their tremendous effort in our sport. We have done our best to make swimming a unique and fun experience for all. I thank you with all my heart and wish you the best as you continue making your own legacy in your life and in your community. Thank you and I look forward to building on the past season on multiple levels.

My congratulations to all those officials, who have gained their BOP or NZ qualifications this year. From timekeeping to refereeing, you are an important part of our sport.

Our ongoing focus is to encourage our existing team of officials to improve their skills and qualifications at both Bay of Plenty and New Zealand levels.

Our current technical official numbers are as follows:-

Referees	13 qualified, 3 training
Starters	17 qualified, 1 training
AOD	10 qualified
IOT	45 qualified, 9 training
Time Keepers	135 qualified,

Over the past year we have had a drive on getting more timekeepers and our thanks to clubs for their assistance in this. While we appreciate that this is not a Swim NZ requirement, we feel it gives our timekeepers knowledge and confidence to do this important job. It also enables us to encourage these people to further their qualifications to IOT and beyond.

We will continue to encourage clubs to nominate their members to become officials. There are experienced senior officials in most clubs who are available and willing to spend time as mentors, with members of the technical committee available to help with training material / training requirements or exams.

Thank you to all of our technical officials who have assisted at our swim meets over the past 12 months. We hope that your involvement was enjoyable and rewarding, and look forward to seeing you on pool deck in the future.

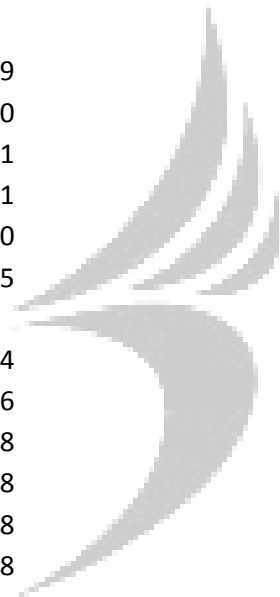

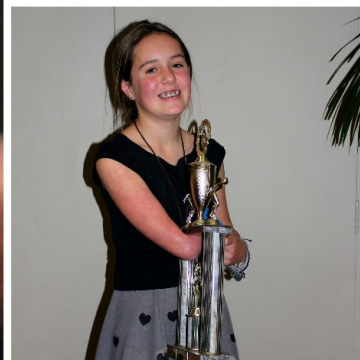
